### TIME TO THINK SESSIONS

## BEYOND THE BELL: HOW LUNCHTIME PLAY EXTENDS THE CURRICULUM AND SUPPORTS BEHAVIOUR (AM ONLY)

In this session, a school leader shares how a strategic focus on outdoor play — grounded in inclusion, autonomy, and purposeful risk — has improved behaviour, enhanced wellbeing, and strengthened the wider curriculum. Discover how reimagining playtimes through a whole-school approach has transformed lunchtime into a rich opportunity for learning, creativity, and social development.

This session explores how effective writing instruction is fundamentally rooted in oracy and play, seamlessly woven into an engaging early years environment that nurtures natural curiosity and expression.

Our expert speakers will share practical strategies and real classroom examples demonstrating how purposeful play, rich oral language experiences and thoughtfully designed learning environments create the perfect conditions for children to flourish as confident writers from their earliest years.



### DISCIPLINARY LITERACY, WITH SHAREEN WILKINSON (AM & PM)

In this engaging session, Shareen will share key insights from her latest book, 'Disciplinary Literacy in Primary Schools'. She will delve into the crucial role of talk and reading in fostering deep learning across the subject disciplines. Participants will explore how oral language is used distinctively in science, history, and geography, and how these differences impact on reading and speaking approaches. What does it mean to read, talk and write like a scientist, historian or geographer in the primary classroom?

### CREATING INDEPENDENT MATHEMATICAL PROBLEM-SOLVERS,

### WITH GARETH METCALFE (AM & PM)

We want all children to grow as flexible, independent mathematical problem-solvers. We want their maths experiences to be intellectually and emotionally rich. In this session, we will explore how children can engage in a range of problem-solving tasks so that all children access tasks and all children are challenged. We will consider the routines that enable children to be mathematically playful and creative, building a love of primary mathematics.

The session will cover some of the key findings from the KS2 national data including any trends and patterns in the data that leaders should be aware of. You will also have the opportunity to hear from the subject teams on the implications of the data for planning and teaching in Year 6 and in younger year groups.

## RHYTHM, REGULATION & READINESS: MOVEMENT THAT SPARKS THE MIND, WITH DRUMBA (PM ONLY)
